- Cheating
- Plagiarism
- Falsified Information
- Collusion
- Unauthorized Collaboration
- Re-using work without permission
- Unfair or Disruptive Conduct are also examples of Academic Misconduct and violations of the Academic Honesty policy.

#### WHAT ARE SOME TRICKS STUDENTS MAY USE TO CHEAT?

- Having another student take an exam in their place.
- "Can I go to the bathroom?" having a book or notes in the bathroom.
- Notes written in Green/Blue books that they bring in for the exam.
- Clickers students who don't attend class give their clicker to other students to receive participation credit without being there.
- Sending/receiving test answers via text message to/from other students.
- Google/Internet searching for answers.
- Programming formulas or answers into calculators.
- Crib notes or cheat sheets.
- Buying papers from a paper mill.
- Entering the class early and writing notes on desktops.
- Writing notes on body palm, between fingers, forearms, thighs, legs, etc.
- ▶ Notes on the label of gum, candy or sports drink bottles.
- Smart watches (sending texts or an app.)
- Taking photos of exams w/phone and sharing with friends.
- Submitting a "bad file" to instructor to buy more time to submit.
- Wearing sunglasses to make it harder to detect cheating during an exam.

### FACULTY ACTION FOR MISCONDUCT

- Assigning a failing grade for the course
- Assigning a failing or zero grade for the piece of work
- Assignment of additional work or re-examination
- Lowering the grade for the specific piece of work
- Complete Faculty Report Form For Academically Related Misconduct and submit form and all supporting documentation to Student Conduct and the Dean's Office for your school.

### WHEN MISCONDUCT OCCURS FACULTY MEMBERS SHOULD...

- Make a determination as to what action will be taken (e.g. zero for assignment).
- Meet with student to hear their side of story and review situation.
- Document all conversations and communications.
- Fill out and submit academic misconduct form, attach all supporting documentation and send to OSC and the Dean's office, ALWAYS.

## TIPS TO DECREASE ACADEMIC MISCONDUCT

Basic misconduct issues and avoidance procedures:

- Syllabus review academic integrity expectations in this document on day one
- In class reminders, test day reminders, new assignment reminders
- Review and define collaboration clarify before each assignment
- Explain the impact of cheating, helping student's see the bigger picture impacts.
